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IMPORTANCE OF EDUCATION IN SOCIETY

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Education is of great importance in the preservation and transmission of cultural heritage from generation to generation. By studying history, literature and art, individuals gain a deeper understanding of their cultural roots. Education also accelerates cultural evolution by supporting critical thinking and creativity. This allows societies to preserve the true essence of their identity and provide a dynamic, sustainable cultural landscape, thus helping them to adapt to changing times.

The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization - UNESCO declares education accessible to all individuals at all times, regardless of gender, age, race, ethnic and social origin, language, religion, political beliefs, disability. The independent and equitable implementation of education should ensure its full compatibility with other areas of society. The fact that education is conditioned by social, objective and subjective processes draws the attention of society to its support...

Many consider education to be an important means of transmitting cultural values, customs and beliefs from generation to generation. Formal educational institutions play an important role in this process. They teach not only academic knowledge, but also cultural behaviors and knowledge valued by society. In many countries, education systems are organized to familiarize students with the traditions and values of their country. Teaching language, literature, history and social standards plays an important role in representing the cultural heritage of a society and passing it on to the next generation. Schools play an effective role in creating an environment where traditions are shared and community identity is sustained. However, it is important to remember that different cultures and educational systems may have different outcomes and plans for the extent to which schools can fulfill this role. This is an important factor in considering the cultural transmission and educational missions of schools.

Cultural transmission is a guarantee of cooperation, communication and understanding for social cohesion. Similar social norms and values encourage cooperation and communication between individuals, thus reducing the likelihood of miscommunication and conflict.

Children's primary education is often their first formal educational experience. During this formative period, schools seek to instill social and cultural values and basic academic skills. Primary school curricula often include subjects that represent the cultural heritage of a society, such as language, literature, history and social



studies. Through these areas of education, students learn about their cultural identity, history and national traditions. The results of Asim Özdemir's (2006) study on the impact of school principals on education show that it is extremely important for school principals to create, maintain and promote a school culture through their successful leadership approaches. Under successful leadership, it is necessary to create and maintain a suitable school environment. This increases the participation of the board of education, teacher satisfaction, student statistics and a positive reputation of the school. Supportive environments promote teamwork, reduce behavioral problems, and prepare students for new responsibilities and tasks. This ultimately develops a sense of community that improves the learning and development environment throughout the school. At the same time, the effectiveness of management processes in primary schools yi, changes the overall educational experience, affecting both students and teachers. Effective educational experience in primary school is largely dependent on effective management. Well-organized processes ensure continuous efficiency, which in turn creates an effective learning environment. A clear vision is defined by strong leadership that guides the school community towards common goals. Prioritizing professional development and teacher support keeps teachers prepared and motivated. As can be seen, the role of school culture in shaping the management processes of primary schools in the ever-changing environment of modern education is emerging as a critical factor affecting educational outcomes. The combination of traditions and values that make up the school environment has a great impact on collaboration, communication, leadership and teacher morale. In addition, a welcoming culture encourages innovation, flexibility and parental involvement in response to changing educational demands. After all, there are many different tasks and processes in primary school management. This requires streamlining management components, improving policies, and creating an environment that supports effective teaching. However, differences in education systems and cultural backgrounds may lead to different perspectives and methods in implementing these management components.
